Main aims and goals

The project aims to increase the capacity of 7 youth organizations to provide non-formal environmental education and empower young people to be environmentally active. Indeed, youngsters are the most exposed to climate changes, increasing pollution and certain health diseases (such as lung cancer, heart disease and acute respiratory infections, notes the World Health Organization) and youth organizations essential role in youth education and play an preparing them to become responsible citizens with global values. Also, the project supports the new EU youth strategy, prioritizing youth concern for protection environmental by increasing their involvement in sustainable programs, while, opens the door to organizations and young people to connect with European partner countries facing similar issues for fostering mobility, education and volunteering.

Donkey collecting rubbish in streets of Castelbuono, Sicily (Italy)

Castelbuono is a Zero Waste town of 10.000hab in Sicily, Italy, which has managed to develop an innovative system to marry sustainability, social work and economics. They decided to link the recovery of a traditional donkey-breed from Sicily with the challenges of the waste collection in narrow streets and the social work to reintegrate people into society;

It was introduced a method of collecting the waste with the use of donkeys instead of trucks. The old town consists of many narrow streets and steps meaning that it is impossible to pass through them in a motor vehicle.

Donkeys are used to do the door-to-door separate collection of trash. On one hand it makes donkeys useful so that recovering this breed stops being a cost to become an asset and all of this without scaring off the big number of tourists that visit the fantastic medieval castle or buy local products of this Sicilian town.

The Sewing Workshop

The impact is considerable, taking into account that buying a small truck to collect waste costs more than 15,000eur and lasts 5 to 10 years whereas a donkey costs less than one tenth and last longer. Plus the maintenance costs of donkeys are a lot lower and they don't need oil or electricity to run which makes them more cost efficient in a world of ever rising oil prices.

Besides, donkeys can be useful when they are not working collecting waste; on one hand their milk is considered to be the closest to human milk and hence very much valued.

Donkyes are cute and friendly animals that don't pollute the environment like motor vehicles do and are also much quieter!

In addition, they are ideal therapists for people with special illnesses such as autistic children and for people recovering from drug problems: Onotherapy -therapy with donkeys is proving wonders on mentally disabled people. It have social effect because it becomes a way to reintroduce socially excluded people -with mental or addiction problems- thanks to using contact with animals as a therapy -onotherapy- and finally it turns waste collection into a tourist attraction and an education tool.

Visit to the Municipality of Tusa: good practice in recycling and waste sorting

Meeting Mayor and ecological operators who explained the D2D collection system in Tusa.

Sorting waste at home for a door to door collection system is one of the best environmentally sustainable waste management methods. Specifically, it refers to the collection system where citizens place domestic waste close to the street in personal waste containers. In Tusa was introduced about 15 years ago for reducing the impact of the trash and garbage, having a cleaner town and environment. There is a calendar as follows:

Monday organic, Tuesday plastic, Wednesday paper, Thursday organic, Friday undifferentiated waste, Saturday organic + glass ad cans. For bulky waste you have to call and book the pick up.

My environmental reality

The activity starts when the facilitator asks the participants to reflect on environmental issues that they are facing in their own communities and countries. After 5 minutes, the facilitator invites the participants to write on a flipchart all the issues that came to their mind, putting them one under the other. While this process happens, the facilitator invites participants to give a bit more context about the issues they brought up and why are they crucial.

After everyone has shared, the facilitator puts the participants into smaller groups of 4-6 people, and invites each group to select one of the issues mentioned to further investigate. Each group selects an issue and has 30 minutes to discuss about its existence in its local contexts and to investigate data around it on the internet. After these 30 minutes, each group presents in plenary the issues and the discussion that took place in the group for around 10 minutes per group. After that, there 5-10 minutes of Q&A between the group that is presenting and the rest of the group.





Body Expression

Body Expression is an activity that starts with body warm-up activities such as stretching and progresses into physical activities that are performed in groups and individually. Through the guidance of an instructor, the group is engaged into performing specific poses, which later can be improvised by the participants. In fact, after the presentation of the poses by the instructor, the group is invited to perform the poses in a creative and personal way, encouraging in this way spontaneity, expression and connection with others. It is recommended that a flow between the instructed activities is followed, so that the group engages into a continuous and focused process. What has been really effective for the group's bonding during the implementation process was the following practice: The instructors invites the participants to respond "YEAH" after each time that the instructor says "OKAY?". This has been energizing at the same time for the group, and has been used throughout the whole youth exchange. Requirement: Natural person with experience in the execution of corporal expression workshops and work with human groups, which through them promote integration, reinforce institutional values, identity and healthy lifestyles.

Recreation Workshop (Christmas Edition)

The activity concerns the reusage of used clothes into upscaled clothes, according to the participants' preference. Participants were invited 2 weeks before by an open call to participate in the activity by bringing old clothes they they don't want to use anymore, with the prospect of transforming them into clothes that they will want to use. Through the guidance of an experienced person on sewing and on recreation of clothes, the participants were given ideas on what are potential combinations that they can make, and guidance on how to sew. In parallel with the workshop, there was also the possibility to create Christmas decoration and outfits, given that the event happened around Christmas holidays.



Climate Fresk

Through a shared understanding of the mechanisms at work, Climate Fresk enables both individuals and organisations to have an open and positive conversation about climate solutions. Participants leave the workshop having formed a strong bond with each other, and well implement equipped to the climate actions that they've identified.

1 – Reasoning

Participants discover the game's cards, they think together to link the cards with each other and thus highlight the causes and consequences of climate change.

2 – Creativity

After identifying the causes, mechanisms and consequences, the participants trace the links and illustrate the Climate Fresk.

3 - Discussion

After this common diagnosis, time for discussion. The aim? To share feelings and reflect on collective solutions, in order to propel action.



Sustainable building

Throughout history, people have fabricated shelters that fit their surroundings. With a universal set of criteria in mind including access to tools, availability of materials, and type of climate—individuals from all over the world constantly reinterpret, reimagine, and redefine the concept of home. To many of us, a home is a four-walled fixture on a permanent foundation. But to others, it is a snowy sanctuary, a hidden cave, or even a floating boat. Here, we explore these different types of houses in order to understand how and why such a wide range of shelters exist across the globe.

A sustainable project serves more than the immediate function of the building. It must also meet the needs of the local community, support active street life, promote healthy lifestyles, provide ecosystem services, and create a sense of place. Site selection and design play important roles in both reducing greenhouse gas emissions and helping projects adapt to the effects of climate change. If people can use public transportation, ride bicycles, or walk to the building, the project helps reduce the carbon emissions associated with commuting. A project that is connected to the community by pedestrian paths and bicycle lanes encourages people to walk or bike instead of drive, not only helping to reduce air pollution, but also promoting physical activity.

World café

The event consists of 4 (it depends on the number of questions) 10-15-minute rounds of group discussion at tables, followed by a group synthesis. After each round, one person stays behind to serve as a "host" of the next round, while the rest travel to other tables as "ambassadors." In this sense, participants have a chance to go "around the world" and bring their ideas with them from table to table. During the rounds of discussion, encourage participants to link ideas from one round to the next.

Here are some things to consider:

• Spend the first few minutes talking about the last conversation. The "host" can present ideas left at the table, and the "ambassadors" should talk about what they've brought from their respective places.

• Leave evidence. Draw key ideas out on the table. For the next group to appreciate the previous conversation, they will need some artifacts to respond to and build on.

• Connect diverse viewpoints and respect contributions. If needed, use a "talking stick" or button to manage each other's input.

• Look for patterns. By the second and third rounds, themes and larger patterns will emerge in the discussion. Encourage participants to look for these and make them evident by drawing or writing them toward the middle of the tables.

After the last round, it's time for a town hall discussion to synthesize what the groups have discovered. Referring back to the questions that matter, ask what the answers were at the different tables, and how they are connected.

We believe what Yuu has done will benefit the students in the long term and we hope to have more opportunity to work with Yuu Organization to organize more workshops like this for more ethnic students in Kon Tum in the near future.

Plastic recycling

EVOL Vietnam have completed the workshop on plastic waste and made eco-brick at Saigon University.

The workshop is coorganized with the Faculty of Environmental Science and more than 30 students. We practiced making a lot of eco-bricks in just 1 and a half hours . Hopefully this workshop will be the beginning of ideas to develop the next workshop from students at Saigon University.

PollutantExtractionProgramLake Yaya

Description

This workshop consisted of collecting polluting solid waste around Lake Yaya. Also, the importance of the lake for coastal marine fauna related to the Humboldt Current was explained.

Objectives

Reduce solid waste that contaminates Lake Yaya.

Educate about coastal marine fauna in the Humboldt Current and promote their protection.

Raise awareness among people about the disposal of their waste and the importance of not damaging ecosystems, specifically where marine fauna live, since they are seriously affected by garbage in the seas.



Waste segregation, recycling and composting workshop

Description

In this workshop, basic concepts of waste segregation, recycling and composting were taught. This is based on non-formal education and didactic learning.

General objective

Educate about the efficient segregation of waste, the recycling process and its importance for the environment. In addition, teach the basic concepts of a compost pile, thus promoting responsible attitudes towards the environment.

Specific Objectives

Make known what waste segregation is, its importance and how to carry it out. Encourage the creativity of the participants around recycling to create new useful products.

Knowing the Environment to Protect It.

In Peru, the educational policy on environmental education does not pay attention to the practical activities of environmental conservation or transition to an eco-coexistence with the environment. Within the school stage, this knowledge is important because it becomes part of the comprehensive training of new citizens. In that sense, it is important to approach these issues in a practical way and direct these efforts to teach children and adolescents.

Roll-out of the Workshop:

Introduction - Presentation of the team and the workshop. (5 min)

Creation of teams - 4 or 5 teams will be created. (7 min)

Bee activity - The bee game will be played in turns while explaining the importance of bees in the environment. It ends with reflective questions about the activity. (34 min)

Gardening activity - The seedlings will be planted, by teams, in an area of the school. It ends with reflective questions about




